### What will I know and be able to do by the end of the unit?


- I can use a basic cross and back stitch.

### Specific Vocabulary

Spelling	Definition
Tie-dye	Produce patterns by tying parts of it to shield it from the dye.
Batik	A method of producing coloured designs on textiles by dyeing them, having first applied wax to the parts to be left undyed.
Wax	Used in batik to resist the dye when creating a pattern.
Tjanting	Instrument used for applying hot wax in batik work.
Resist	Withstand the dye.

### Previously visited vocabulary

Stitch	the process of threading through fabric
Knot	a fastening made by looping a piece of string, rope, or something similar on itself and tightening it.
Tack Stitch	a temporary way to hold materials together
Joining	To link or connect
Needle	Used for sewing two materials together

Spelling	Definition
Embroidery	Decorate by sewing patterns with thread.
Straight stitch	A single short separate embroidery stitch. 
Back stitch	A method of sewing with overlapping stitches. 
Running Stitch	A method of stitching consisting of a line of small even stitches without overlapping. 
Texture	The feel or appearance of a material.
Pattern	A repeated decorative design.
