Eco-Schools Topic: Litter

Aim: To create awareness of the impact of litter on the environment and the impact of litter on our school ground.

Action(s):

- To create a litter pick rota for KS1 and KS2 pupils.
- To participate in a whole school assembly and workshops from a Greenpeace speaker to learn about the impact of litter on our world.
- To create posters to highlight the importance of cleaning up our litter.
- To request new outdoor bins

How long will it take?

- To be in place and working effectively by the end of the summer term.
- A continuous effort that will remain in place and adapted yearly.

Who is responsible?
