Rationale:

In order to implement our intent, we have: ○

Opportunities for whole school and class enrichment

- A scheme of work that focuses on specific and relevant vocabulary
- Ensured that staff are equipped with the necessary professional development to deliver our curriculum
- Clear and comprehensive scheme of work in line with the National Curriculum
- A scheme of work that focuses on progressive skills and knowledge in performing, understanding and appreciating music
- Planned opportunities to learn music within a wider context alongside other curriculum subjects
- Participation in local music festivals, such as Singfest, Young Voices and school productions
- Offer of peripatetic music lessons for all children
- Specialist teaching of an instrument in Key Stage 2
- A love of music performing and appreciating music encouraged and promoted
- Extra-curricular opportunities to participate in music
- A subject leader who monitors teaching and learning to improve standards and outcomes
- A link governor who liaises with the subject leader in order to monitor and improve standards
- A curriculum that meets the needs of all pupils (including SEND and PPG)
